First, the Police Department is accepting donations of new fans for our program to assist in continuing to offer the service to those in need. We are asking for box style fans that are new and in original packaging.

Community Action Team (C.A.T.) members are available to assist citizens who need to pick up or drop off fans Monday through Friday, from 9am - 5pm at the Lexington Police Department, located at 111 Maiden Lane.

In addition to the Fan Donation Program, C.A.T. members also check on our senior population through the Elderly Home Checks Program. This critical service allows residents and family members the security of know their friends and family are safe and responsive through these 100 degree days.

The program allows for personal interaction with the officers to answer any questions, provide items such as a fan or assist in coordinating services offered through the Lexington County Recreation and Aging Commission such as Meals on Meals food delivery or transportation for a doctor's appointment.



Curbside Trash and Recycling Collection



Please note: household trash, yard debris and recycling are all picked up on Tuesday.

Roll carts, recycle bins and yard debris need to be out on the curb by 7am.

Yard debris - grass, leaves, pine straw, etc. should be bagged. Limbs should be no longer than 4 feet in length and 4 inches in diameter. If they are not in compliance, the garbage collector will leave a red tag on one of the limbs.

Yard debris bags are provided for free and can be picked up from Town Hall in quantities of 5 at a time.

Cardboard boxes go out with yard debris. The boxes need to be broken down with no garbage inside.

Acceptable items collected at curbside recycling:

Newspapers and magazines less than 1 inch
Aluminum, metal cans and lids
Cardboard or boxes (not waxed/plastic coated)
Plastic bottles and jugs (slender neck/screw top)
Office paper and junk mail

DO NOT use plastic bags/ties in the recycle bin

The Town requests that GLASS be recycled at any of the Lexington County Convenience Stations.
