Fallen Firemen 5K

Lexington County Fire Service will host the Fallen Firemen 5K race on Saturday, October 1, 2016 at 8:00am, starting at 111 Maiden Lane.

Proceeds benefit the Jeffrey Vaden Chavis House at the Burn Center at Doctors Hospital in Augusta, GA.

The house is named in memory of Jeffrey Vaden Chavis, who began his firefighting career as an 18-year old volunteer for the Round Hill Fire Department in Lexington.

On July 12, 2001, at the age of 22, Jeffery lost his life as a result of burns suffered while in the line of duty from fighting a residential fire. After his loss, the Chavis family, along with Lexington County Fire Service, wanted to do something in his honor that could help families be part of the care and recovery of their loved ones.

Over the last decade they have raised money to sponsor the Chavis House, a home-away-from home, within walking distance of the Burn Center. The house serves approximately 1,000 guests per year. There, family members can be near their loved ones as they fight for survival and endure the long process of healing and rehabilitation as they recuperate from injuries.

The Southeastern Firefighters Burn Foundation is a 501(c)(3) public charity that provides compassionate assistance to the families of patients being treated at the Joseph M. Still Burn Center at Doctors Hospital in Augusta, Georgia. They help meet the needs of the families while in Augusta and assist the patient with non-medical expenses related to follow-up care including: free lodging, daily meal service, transportation, medication, clothing, and anti-scarring garments.
